POPULATION

Individuals identifying as African American alone comprised 27.2 % of South Carolina's population, making them the most numerous minority group in the state. (Source: American Community Survey, 2013-2017, DP05, Demographic and Housing Estimates)



MF GAP

In 2017, the African American median household income in South Carolina was \$31,960. African Americans make about 57 cents for every dollar made by South Carolina's majority population. (Source: American Community Survey 2013-2017 5 -Year Estimates, B19013A-B: Median Household Income by Race)

EDUCATION

In 2017, the overall dropout rate for South Carolina students was 2.4%. At a rate of 2.5%. African American student dropout was comparable to the overall dropout rate. (Source: South Carolina Department of Education. Report on Student Dropout Rates 2016-2017)
