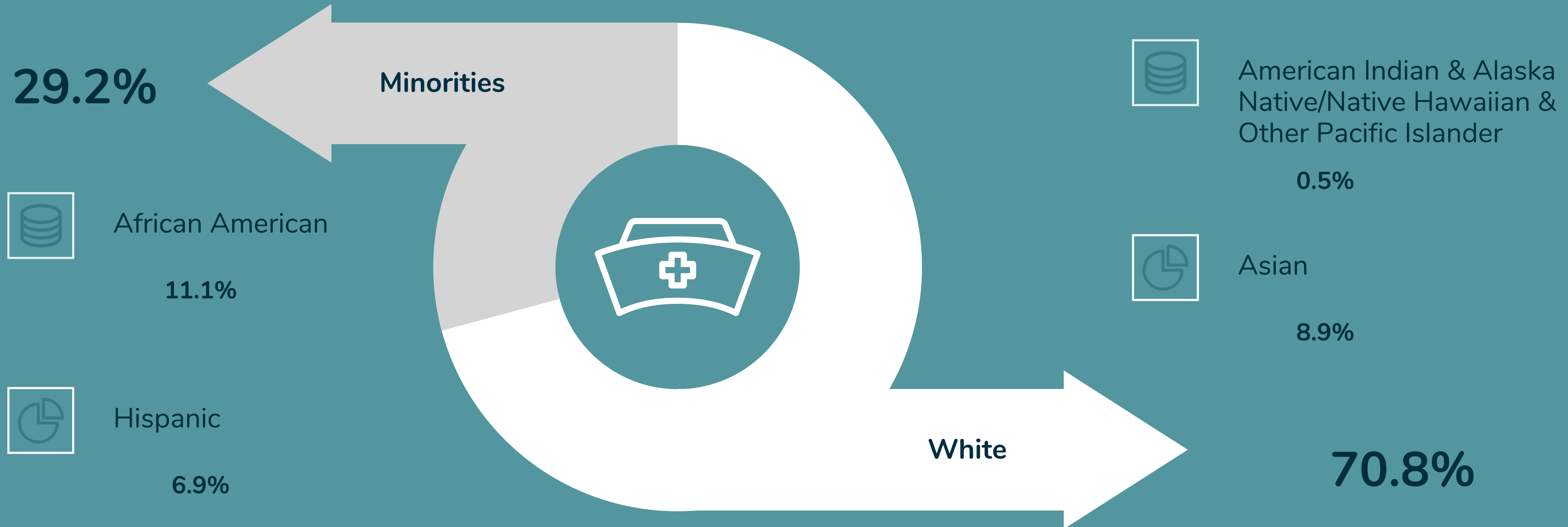

Minorities as a Share of those Employed as Registered Nurses, National 2014-2018



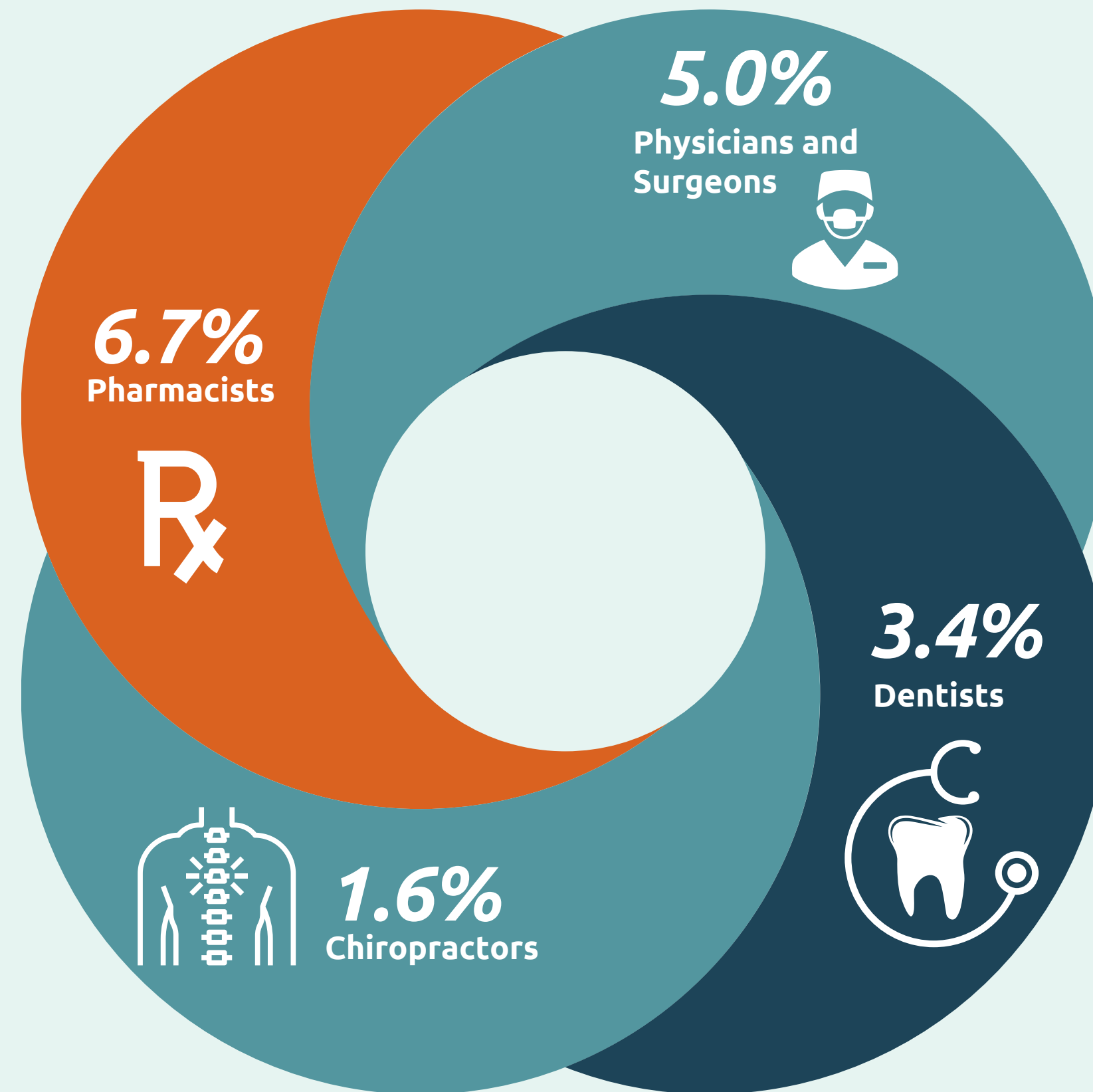
Balance of not Hispanic or Latino : 1.8%

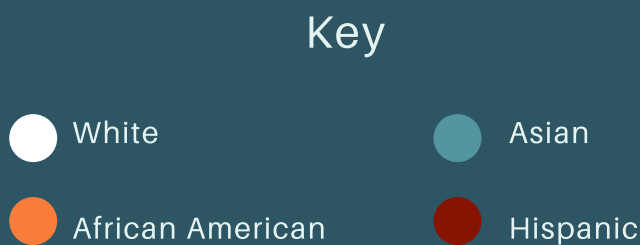

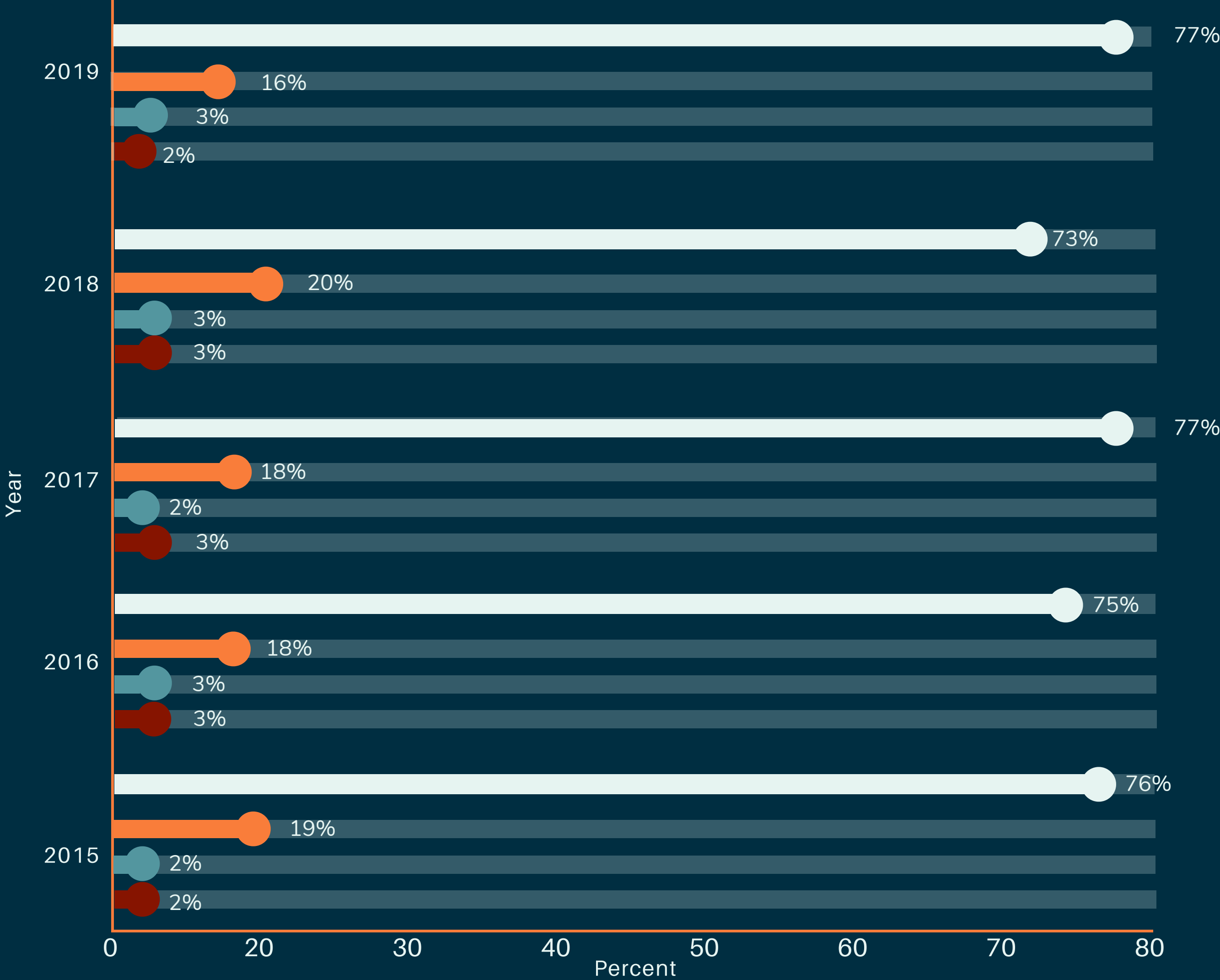
African Americans as a Share of those Employed across Several Health Care Occupations, National 2014-2018
